

DAY 1* 14NM

NAPLES & PROCIDA

Italy's Amalfi coast is considered one of the most romantic destinations to spend your summer. Today your adventure begins in Naples, the third largest city on the Amalfi coast. This remarkable city is an archaeological treasure that was deemed a UNESCO World Heritage Site for all the reasons that make it a truly breath taking sight to see. Naples is also a food haven that offers an array of unique dishes, so today you will enjoy the finest wines and delectable flavors of Italian cuisine.

After you've explored Naples, the next stop is the best-kept secret on the Amalfi coast, Procida. This is the smallest Island off the mainland, derived from a Neapolitan term which literally translates to "soft beaches". You'll understand the meaning of the name when you visit the amazing beaches on the island and enjoy the wonderful fragrance of nearby lemon groves while dining at one of the seaside restaurants. The picturesque pastel-colored houses will tempt you to take a stroll through the sun-drenched streets of the waterfront villages.

ISCHIA

The green island of Ischia is covered in lush Mediterranean vegetation and thick pine forests. Ischia is also known as the island of 'Well Being' as its many volcanic hot springs and thermal baths are renowned for their relaxing, rejuvenating and healing properties. Take full advantage of this amazing natural experience at Poseidon or Negombo gardens.

You can also find shady forests, vineyards and a collection of small towns and beaches on this pristine island. Towering high up on the rocks, you can explore Castello Aragonese with its stunning view of the city and harbor. Further down towards the center is Lacco Ameno, the place to be for many delicious restaurants and a lively atmosphere. To watch the sunset, you can enjoy the hospitality aboard and have a cocktail with a perfect view of the beautiful coast of Ischia.



CAPRI

Take a deep breath of the fresh sea air and prepare yourself for exquisite views and dramatic cliffs that stretch as far as the eye can see. You are now in the jewel of Southern Italy, Capri. The 'Blue Grotto' is a popular attraction as the gigantic boulders and tall trees create a radiant backdrop for the perfect day of sunbathing on the rocks or swimming in the magical water.

Once you've rinsed off the salt, head inland to historical sites, hiking trails or go release the shopaholic within you. This stylish Italian destination is increasingly popular due to the boutiques, designer shops, galleries and restaurants. The center of the town is called Piazza Umberto, a public square with narrow streets and alleys that will lead you to all sorts of new discoveries.









DAY 4

NERANO

Nerano is a beautiful fishing village situated between Sorrento and Amalfi. There is a large mesmerizing beach only accessible by water and surrounded by mountains, it is just perfect for relaxing in the crystal clear calm water or snorkelling around the exotic marine life.

Visit one of the fantastic beachfront restaurants all serving the famous specialty of Nerano, 'spaghetti alla Nerano' complimented by delicious local wine and stunning views. Jump on the tender and find the perfect location to spend the day jet skiing, kayaking or paddle boarding with a view of the greater Campania region or relax on the sundeck with a tropical cocktail. After you've soaked up the Italian sunrays, head ashore for dinner to the highly recommended Quattro Passi.



POSITANO & FIORDO DI FURORE

On the fifth day of your charter, the bright and vibrant Positano awaits you. This chic town with peach and terracotta colors everywhere boasts the most spectacular scenery with loads of activities around every bend of the narrow winding streets. There are many handmade leather goods to be bought as well as pieces of art, jewellery and local produce. Dine at easy-going Da Bruno, a restaurant overlooking the town that serves southern-Italian style dishes and if you fancy something a bit more glamorous, head to Next2, an alfresco restaurant facing the sea that serves delectable dishes of grilled octopus and fresh pasta. If you want to go sightseeing in Positano the main monument to see is the Santa Maria Assunta, a domed shaped church that dominates the landscape of the town.

Later in the day you can explore Fiordo di Furore, a little town with a natural inlet that appears as a crack in the hillside. This peaceful town is perfect to relax, sit back and enjoy the sunset with a cocktail in hand.









DAY 6

*3NM

AMALFI

Amalfi lies at the mouth of a deep ravine surrounded by dramatic cliffs and coastal scenery. This town is home to the magnificent Saint Andrew's Cathedral, which is visible from all angles of the island. Amalfi is famous for the production of the liquor 'Limoncello', a delicious lemon liquor that is traditionally enjoyed after a meal. Should you decide to have lunch ashore, Le Palme Ristorante Pizzeria offers great pizza, seafood and Mediterranean cuisine.

With a belly filled with genuine Italian cuisine and delicious dessert, take a short walk to the beach and relax until you're ready to explore the old archwaycovered boat yard or ask your crew to get all the available water sports ready for an afternoon of fun.







DAY 7

*25NM

SORRENTO

Sorrento's popularity stems from its location at the western gateway to the Amalfi, it overlooks the spectacular Bay of Naples and a clear view of Mount Vesuvius. Wander through Piazza Tasso, a cafe-lined square that'll expose you to one of Italy's finest palatial hotels, magnificent marquetry shops and simple Campanian restaurants serving 'gnocchi alla sorrentina' finished off with a shot of ice-cold limoncello. Don't forget to stop and admire the spectacular sunsets from the scenic view point at the public Villa Comunale park.

Shop along the main thoroughfare of Corso Italia for clothing and fashion boutiques and the lanes of the historic center like Via San Cesareo and its cross streets for workshops where they make and sell leather goods and unique inlaid wood designs. Visit these local craftsmen and buy beautiful souvenirs for the amazing memories that you will have in this picturesque town

DAY 8*13NM

NAPLES


