

### **PAROS**

The Archaeological Museum in Athens has a vast number of statues that were found at various sites within Paros. There are also some very interesting historical monuments, check out the ancient windmill and the fascinating Church of 100 doors. Taste the local cuisine at Taverna Tsitsanis or walk down the narrow paved alleys. Paros is slowly becoming the next Mykonos, with a dazzling night life and an array of fine dining restaurants

## **DAY 5**\*20NM

### **SANTORINI**

Santorini is the Queen to Mykonos' King. The perfect location for romance, culture and picturesque sunsets, no wonder it's a bucket-list destination. The steep western coastline is countered by the vast eastern beaches, mixing up the sand with the pebbles. Head up to Fira, the capital of Santorini, make a new friend and head up the path by donkey back or for those of you who'd prefer to take the high road, we suggest the cable car. Before you know it, you'll be on the narrow winding streets of Fira.

Down the center of the city runs the Sacred Way. These buildings include groups of houses, marketplaces, baths, theaters, sanctuaries, the residence of Ptolemy Euergetes, tombs of the Archaic and Classical periods and Early Christian remains.











### **MILOS**

Welcome to unspoiled Milos, with stunning landscapes, spectacular rock formations, caves, and thermal springs, inspiration of sorts for the back of a postcard. The Island was once home to the famous statue of Aphrodite, which has been relocated to the Louvre Museum in Paris. However, there are still plenty of local masterpieces and sites to explore, including churches, catacombs, and the Naval Museum. Grab a bite to eat at Al Fresco within the pretty port of Pollonia.

The two famous beaches on the island are Kleftiko and Sarakiniko. Kleftiko used to be an old hide-out for pirates and the geologic formations created by the wind and sea are the perfect place for swimming and exploration. Both beaches are only accessible by sea. Sarakiniko beach is one of the most photographed locations in all of the Cyclades, boasting white volcanic rocks standing tall against the sapphire blue waters of the idyllic Aegean Sea.

### **SERIFOS**

Moving on to greener pastures, Serifos is one of the few islands in the Cyclades Islands that has lush vegetation, with sandy beaches, serene landscape and picturesque villages. The rocky coastline is deeply indented with a chain of coves and bays. White houses ascend all the way to the Venetian Castle, like something out of a fairy tale, head up the trail and take a look for yourself.

Serifos is surrounded by magnificent beaches on every coast and countless trekking paths with local flora growing everywhere. The island's most enchanting spot is its capital, Chora, an ancient village sitting high on a hilltop, promising unbelievable views of the glowing horizon below.

### **ATHENS**


